God Serves His People: Our Lutheran Way of Worship: The Scripture Lessons

We now come to one of the high points in our service, as we pause and listen as God speaks to us in His word. In the readings, God speaks through the prophets, men of the Old Testament who wrote of the Christ who was yet to come. Then we hear from the apostles, usually the letters (epistles) of St. Paul. The crown jewel of the Service of the Word is the reading of the Gospel, the very words and earthly actions of Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

We follow a system of lessons known as a pericope, which is used to guide us in the Word. This keeps us from becoming narrow in our study of the Word, and brings to our remembrance the triumphant deeds of our Lord, as well as proclaiming His holy will for us as we live in this world and reassuring us of His promises to us as His children.

The Gradual may be a psalm text, helping us focus on the lesson theme. Then, in the Alleluia Verse, we respond joyfully to the Word of God—it is the Word of Life!

Keep the verse close to your heart by learning the actions below.

"I am the vine" - Move arms around in the air.

"you are the branches" - Stand as still as a tree with your hands up.

"If you remain in me and I in him," – Hug your arms around your body.

"You will bear much fruit." - Act like you are picking fruit off of a tree.

"Apart from me you can do nothing." - Hold your arms apart with your palms out.



ACTION RESPONSE

The Easter joy began with women at the empty tomb being sent out with a message that Jesus has been raised (Mark 16:6).

We, like the women, are sent out into the world with the good news of Jesus Christ's victory over sin and death. It was the same for Philip who met the Ethiopian eunuch on a wilderness road (Acts 8:26).
