SUNDAY SCHOOL: This week in our Christian education time, we study "A Divided Kingdom." Solomon's heir, Rehoboam, ignored the pleas of the people to lighten their load; instead, he threatened to make their workload even more difficult. Angered by his response, ten tribes of Israel make Jeroboam their leader, leaving Rehoboam to lead only the tribes of Judah and Benjamin in

Jerusalem, where the temple was. As a family, discuss how the division of the kingdom affected the worship life of the people. Ask, "How could dividing yourself from church affect your worship life?"

We say, "I believe", for faith is an individual matter, and no one can believe for us. We stand as we confess our faith, showing our readiness to profess and to live according to our faith. The Apostles' Creed is a statement of our baptismal faith and is the regular creed. When Holy Communion is celebrated, it is appropriate to use the Nicene Creed. Want to know what Christians believe? The creed is a great place to start!

CREATIVE RESPONSE

Read Psalm 1.

People who are faithful to God's teachings (law) are "like trees planted by streams of water".

God's teachings oppose the 'wicked' around us that represent the worst of the world's standards.

These trees do not wither but yield fruit and prosper. Similarly, the lives of the followers of Jesus do not wither as they are fed by God's word.
