Our Lutheran Worship: The Sermon

The sermon is not just a number of off-the-cuff remarks in the middle of the service. It is a carefully and prayerfully prepared exposition of the word of God. The sermon is instruction in God's word to us; it is testimony to what God has done for us; and it is a message of encouragement and exhortation for us to live as the redeemed people of God.

The pastor is responsible for preaching the word, but it takes two to make a sermon. We all should give careful heed to the teaching and instruction given in the sermon, for although it is spoken by man, it is the Word of God. Jesus says: "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it!"" (Luke 11:28, ESV) We listen to His word, meditate upon it and let it take root in our hearts, and then keep and observe it in our lives.

As the sermon ends, the pastor pronounces, "The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Cf. Phil. 4:7) This benediction speaks of the promised blessing of peace upon all who stand fast in the Word of the Lord and worship Him.
