

ONCE AGAIN, WE DRAW NEAR TO THE SACRED SEASON OF LENT, which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. We will hold special services to lead us to the cross and a deeper appreciation of all that our Saviour has done for us in His death and resurrection. Our theme is *The Blessings*



in the Blood of Jesus, and we will be examining what Jesus' blood has accomplished as told in the book of Hebrews.

We will again have a Lenten rotation, sharing together with St. Matthew's, Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, and Prince of Peace. Pastors will be travelling to each church to share a sermon each week. Our services begin each **Wednesday at 6:30 pm**. We hope you will join us for these services.

LENT BIBLE STUDY – MEANS OF GRACE: On Monday nights, beginning March 10 through April 7 at 7pm, and on Tuesday mornings from March 11 through April 8 at 10am, we'll be gathering for a special Bible study on the Means of Grace, which are the ordinary, simple things that God uses to demonstrate His grace to us. SUNDAY SCHOOL: "A Revealing Truth" is the Bible lesson for this week. On Easter afternoon, Jesus joins two disciples discussing the events of the past week in Jerusalem while on their way to Emmaus. Along the way, Jesus interprets the Old Testament prophecies concerning Himself. Arriving at Emmaus, the disciples suddenly recognize Jesus, who then disappears from sight. The disciples quickly return to Jerusalem to share their amazing account. Discuss how you, too, can share this amazing story.

CREATIVE RESPONSE
